Definitions

Feedlot, commercial: - the feeding, farrowing or raising of cattle, swine, sheep, poultry, or other livestock, in a concentrated area where grazing is not possible, where the confinement is for more than six (6) months in any one calendar year, and where the number of animals so maintained exceeds five hundred (500) animal units as defined herein. The area of the concentrated feeding operation shall include the pens, corrals, sheds, buildings, feed storage areas, waste disposal ponds and related facilities. Such facilities shall be constructed and operated in conformance with applicable county, state and federal regulations. Two or more livestock operations under common ownership are deemed to be a single livestock operation 48if they are adjacent to each other or if they utilize a common area or system for the disposal of livestock wastes. Animal units (AU) are defined as follows:

Feedlot, farm: - the feeding, farrowing or raising of cattle, swine, sheep, poultry, or other livestock, in a concentrated area where grazing is not possible, where the confinements is for more than six (6) months in any one calendar year, and where the number of animal units (as described in Feedlot, Commercial) so maintained exceeds 15 animal units and does not exceed 500 animal units. The area of the concentrated feeding operation shall include the pens, corrals, sheds, building, feed storage areas, waste disposal ponds, and related facilities.

Farming: - the planting, cultivating, harvesting and storage of grains, hay or plants commonly grown in Nebraska with the necessary accessory uses for the treating or storing the produce and the feeding of livestock as hereinafter prescribed, provided, that such accessory uses do not include the feeding of garbage or offal to swine or other animals. `(In contrast to a commercial feed lot hereinafter defined, any person or persons operating within the following categories is conducting a farming operation and is not considered as operating a commercial feed lot unless the following is exceeded:

one (1) Animal unit (as defined in Feedlot, Commercial) per acre for a parcel less than forty (40) acres; one and one-half (1½) animal units per acre for that portion of a parcel over forty (40) acres but less than eighty (80) acres, but not more than two (2) animal units per acre for parcels over eighty (80) acres, provided that any combination of animal units in excess of five hundred (500) shall require a Conditional Use Permit.)
