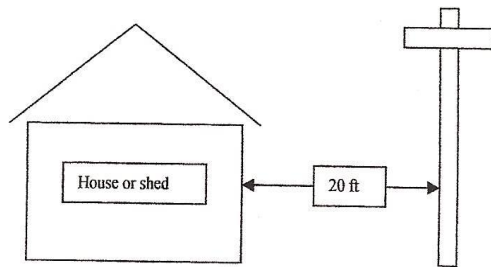

Voltage 750 to 22,000 volts
20ft from utility pole line

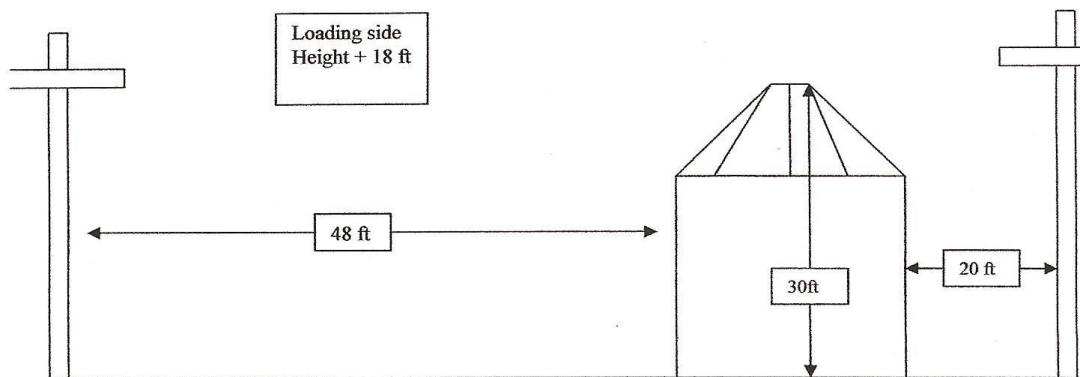


Grain Bin Construction

Recommended Set Backs for Structures by Primary Power Lines
Voltage 750 to 22,000 volts

On Non-loading side of grain bins—20ft from utility pole

On Loading side of grain bins—18ft + Total Height of bin

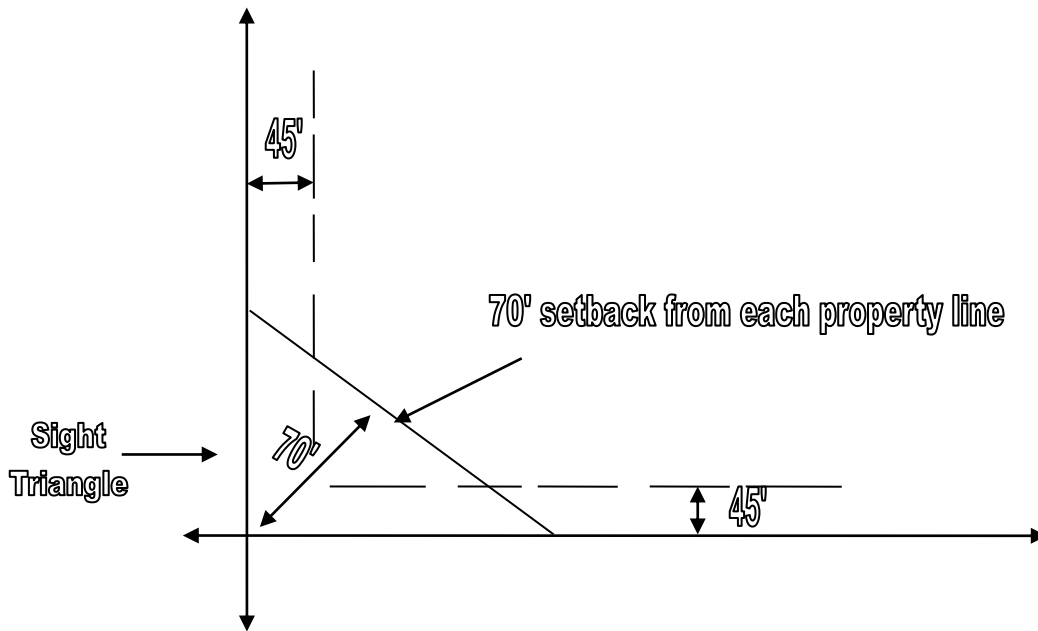


Howard County Setback from Intersections
All road intersections

Yard regulations in each category

Example in A1, page 105: Seventy (70) feet from the right-of-way at intersections. This forms a sight triangle which has the 70' point in the middle of the hypotenuse of an isosceles triangle (two equal sides) formed by the forty-five (45) foot setback and the hypotenuse.

<p>35' setback require a 60' line of site setback 25' setback require a 50' line of site setback.</p>



NOTICE

In accordance with Nebraska State statutes governing electrical licensing and inspections known as the Nebraska State Electrical Act, Sections 81-2101 through 81-2143, footings for new construction are required to be inspected by the state electrical inspector prior to being poured. Failure to do so will result in removal of footings. The person responsible for pouring footings without rough-in inspection will be responsible for all costs for removal and replacement of footings. This is required of all new or existing construction where new service equipment is installed for residential, commercial, industrial, or public use buildings. This is a requirement statewide, inside or outside of the city or village limits. For questions contact the State Electrical Division Office at (402) 471-3550 or a licensed electrician.

State Inspectors

Howard County does not have a building inspector to enforce the Nebraska State Building Codes. It is the responsibility of the owner to meet these codes. To help you, following is information regarding State Qualified Inspectors.
